Fort Gordon, Georgia – The 2013 AAU Cross Country National Championship brought nearly 1,200 of the country's best youth athletes to Augusta, Georgia to compete at Fort Gordon on a very friendly spectator course. With overcast weather and not too chilly, the rain held off just enough for the runners to compete without the mud and wet conditions.

Twelve races were conducted in this championship with a total of 22 divisions between the boys and girls. With the military background, the color guard and military band kicked off the ceremonies and the event began at the normal 9:00am start time.

Derby City Athletic Club ended the California Comets quest for four straight consecutive years as the overall team national champions. Derby City captured the Overall Team National Title by winning team titles in six different divisions. They captured the High School Girls, 13-14 Girls, 11-12 Boys, 9-10 Girls, 9-10 Boys, and 8 & Under Girls. The California Comets did end up winning the 11-12 Boys division, as well as the 8 & Under Boys. Only two other teams captured division national championships. Intensity Athletics captured the 13-14 Boys national title, while Georgia Elite captured the High School Boys Division.
