AAU Hockey announces the 2014 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS in Minnesota for Mites & Squirts

On March 7-8, AAU Hockey - National Chair, Keith Noll and Trevor Hartwig (AAU National Staff) hosted the inaugural AAU Ice Hockey meeting for Mites (7U-8U) and Squirts (9U-10U) at the RiverCentre in St.Paul, MN. The AAU meeting coincided with the 2013 Let's Play Hockey Consumer Expo (the World's largest such consumer expo for hockey) <u>www.letsplayhockey.com/expo.html</u> and the Minnesota State High School Boy's Ice Hockey Tournament.

The expo hosted 150+ exhibitors and was attended by over 40,000 hockey players and fans. The state HS Tournament hosted nearly 120,000 fans, with the games being played at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, which is home to the Minnesota Wild. The tournament and expo facitities are connected to each other.

Representatives from 18 states attended the AAU Hockey meetings discussing opportunities for the AAU Mite and Squirt programs on a National basis. The committee agreed to a National format for this program. As a result of the meeting, the AAU Ice Hockey Program is happy to announce that the inaugural, 'AAU Ice Hockey National Championships' for Mites and Squirts.

The Nationals will be conducted March 6 – 9, 2014 in Edina, Minnesota with the host facility being the <u>Minnesota Made Ice Center</u>. The Committee will be expecting in excess of 1,500 youth hockey players at the AAU championships. There will be free time during the championships so that the teams will have an opportunity to attend the 2014 Let's Play Hockey Conumer Expo and the Minnesota State High School Boy's Hockey Tournament. These events will provide extra excitement for the athletes, coaches, parents and families.

AAU Ice Hockey – Mite-Squirt Nationals

AAU Hockey has selected Minnesota to host our AAU 2014 Mite and Squirt National Championships. <u>Minnesota Made Ice Center</u> in Edina is the host AAU club. However, games will be played at selected facilities throughout the greater Minneapolis-St.Paul area.

The timing of these Nationals will coincide with two other major hockey events, being held on the same weekend (March 6-9, 2014) in St.Paul, MN. These are the <u>Minnesota State High School Boy's Hockey</u> <u>Championships</u> and the <u>Let's Play Hockey Consumer Expo</u>.

Admission into the Expo is free. This is a premiere event and loaded with hockey related exhibits, activities and hockey celebrities. Players, families and coaches should find plenty of events and activities to keep them busy throughout the weekend.

AAU plans to include 72-84 Mite teams and 36-48 Squirt teams participating at several competition levels within the tournaments. Teams will be selected from AAU Leagues and Event throughout the nation.

National Championship Rules

AAU Hockey adopted most of the playing rules already being used by USA Hockey, except for several amendments detailed below.

- <u>All teams playing within AAU sanctioned leagues must be</u> registered with AAU by October 15th, in order to be eligible to participate within the AAU Hockey Nationals.
- Mite and Squirt games shall utilize a <u>9-Dot Faceoff system</u> (please note that 9-Dot Face-off systems are currently being used within the IIHF, NHL, NCAA and within most High School programs).
- Mite and Squirt games shall include 3 periods using <u>15-minute</u> <u>Stop-time</u>. However, if during the 3rd period if the Goal-Differential = 5 or more than timekeeping with switch to run-time. Further, in calculating tiebreakers, the maximum Goal-Differential shall be +5 or -5 for any team.
- Mite classifications shall be played within a conventional <u>Full-Ice</u> <u>Format</u>, as within other age classifications.
- Mite classifications shall utilize <u>Black Pucks</u>. This amendment merely applies Equipment Rule 306(a) to the Mite classification and deletes Rule 306(b). However, AAU Districts and/or sanctioned Leagues are permitted to utilize Blue Pucks by adopting Equipment Rule 306(b) locally.

AAU Ice Hockey – Club Names & Registration

Many of our AAU Ice Hockey Clubs (Teams & Association) do have members who are Individual Participants within both AAU Hockey and within USA Hockey and/or its affiliates.

Of course, dual participation with separate programs is permissible within both organizations. However, USA Hockey has stated that participation in both organizations can lead to some confusion for USAH, Leagues, Tournaments and Administrators. USA Hockey has asked that our Clubs (Teams, Associations & Leagues) who may have members participating within both organizations begin using AAU names that can differentiate the AAU programs from USA Hockey affiliated programs.

For example, let us assume that an existing USAH-based association is named the <u>National Hockey Association (NHA)</u> and some or all of their members (players and/or coaches) wish to participate within both USAH and AAU. It would be preferred that such a new AAU-based association should use a name something like <u>National Hockey Club (NHC)</u>.

Similarly, they ask that our Clubs (Teams, Associations & Leagues) purchase and/or contract for ice-time under the name of their AAU Team or Club (not simply purchase ice-time through a USAH-based organization for use by an AAU-based club).

Team Coaches and/or Managers should assure that they use their AAU names when playing within AAU games and that Associations use their AAU names when hosting AAU events.

AAU memberships may be purchased online at: <u>aausports.org</u>. Please assure that AAU Hockey participants <u>elect the Extended Benefits</u> (AB) membership option (\$16 for youth players and \$18 for non-player <u>adults</u>). Members may register as a specific individual AAU Team or within a larger AAU Club (which may including multiple teams within a larger Association and/or an entire League). The exact structure should be determined locally according to local needs.

AAU Ice Hockey – Scoresheets

Some of our AAU Ice Hockey districts (for example Michigan) have created AAU Ice Hockey scoresheets. We suspect that some of our new AAU leagues may create their own scoresheets, as well.

Similar to the story on the previous page concerning Club Names, it would be helpful for any teams who do obtain any AAU scoresheets to then only use them for AAU games. This would be another way to help differentiate between AAU games and USAH games.

AAU National Qualifier Tournaments

AAU Hockey will be selecting teams to participate within the Mite and Squirt national championships by several methods.

- Teams will be selected from various AAU sanctioned leagues around the nation.
- Teams will also be selected from AAU sanctioned State, District and Regional Championships.

AAU Hockey anticipates that some areas may have difficulty in creating formal AAU sanctioned leagues or in hosting such tournaments. So, <u>AAU Hockey will be sanctioning a series of regional Qualifying</u> <u>Tournaments throughout the United States, to provide the opportunity for</u> <u>less traditional and/or smaller markets to participate within AAU Nationals</u>.

AAU 2014 Great Lakes Regional Championship

Michigan has already hosted Mite Regional Championships for each of the past 2 seasons. Therefore, Michigan has opted out of consideration for hosting the 2014 Great Lakes Regional tournament (provided another state within the region is willing to host the event). The idea being to allow neighboring states to have the opportunity to host this event.

It is hoped that a location within Ohio, Indiana, Illinois or Wisconsin will be selected and that in the future we can begin rotating a Regional Tournament between several states. Michigan has also suggested that other AAU programs consider viewing the President's Day weekend (February 14-17 during 2014) to be the prime-time weekend for hosting such regional playoffs. This can help minimize the amount of school missed by players and work missed by parents & coaches.

Michigan 2014 State Championship

The proposed dates for the <u>Michigan 2014 State Championship</u> has been selected for <u>January 17-20, 2014</u> (which is the MLK holiday weekend). Proposed age classifications include both Mites & Squirts (House & Travel). PeeWees and older may be added if necessary.

Location(s) for the Michigan State Championships are still to be determined. However, as in the article above, the MLK holiday weekend has been selected to help minimize the amount of school missed by players and work missed by parents & coaches. "... AAU Hockey will be sanctioning a series of Regional Qualifying Tournaments throughout the United States, to provide the opportunity for less traditional and/or smaller markets to participate within AAU Nationals."

NSHL – Junior A

The 2012-13 season was the Northern States Hockey League's inaugural year in AAU/UHU sanctioning. The goal of the league is to develop and promote amateur junior A hockey players with the ability and desire to play at the college level.

The seven teams in the league span all of New England, New Jersey and New York. Currently, the teams include; Trenton Habs, Lake George Fighting Spirit, Syracuse Stampede, Cape Cod Islanders, Eastern Kodiaks, Junior Mariners and New England Stars. The success of these teams has attracted additional teams for the 2013-14 season. Beginning next season the league will expand to include teams from Vermont and Maine.



By all measures of junior hockey success the NSHL has done remarkably well during its inaugural AAU season.

The success began at the beginning of the season when a team competed in the Woodchuck Classic and were competitive against EJHL teams, including the reigning USA Hockey national champion. This success was parlayed into other teams playing teams from as far away as Richmond, Virginia

to gain exposure for players as well as notoriety for the league.

Throughout the season there were a number of well played games. New rivalries were created and old ones rekindled. The standing rivalry of Lake George Fighting Spirit and Syracuse Stampede was a flash back to league championship play last season.

The culmination of the league's success was the college placements. This year there have been six college commitments already. Syracuse has placed four players. They have one going to play for Ferris State (D1), SUNY Morrisville, SUNY Canton and Western New England University. Lake George Fighting Spirit has two players committed to Southern Maine University and SUNY Canton. And finally, the Trenton Habs have a player committed to Worcester State.

For a new league with AAU affiliation these college placements are the pinnacle of junior hockey success. The league looks forward to building on this season's success next year with an expanded league with even more college placements.


