Entering Michigan's 3rd Season AAU Mites field over 50 full-ice teams

On August 28th, the Michigan Amateur Youth Hockey League (MAYHL) held their inaugural face-off meeting at a jam-packed Plymouth Cultural Center. MAYHL hosted over 60 AAU Hockey coaches and managers from around Michigan and northern Ohio.

Only 2 weeks into the AAU online registration process, Hockey Michigan (AAU) memberships have more than tripled over the same period last season. At present, the MAYHL is home to 17 Mite A (2006) and 27 Mite AA (2005) teams. A growing number of Mite B teams are still in the process of forming their clubs and setting up their divisions.

Similar growth has been reported from the New York based Greater Niagara Amateur Hockey League (GNAHL) in their second AAU season. Hockey Illinois is having an outstanding registration period during only their first AAU season. Present reports from the combined states of Illinois, Ohio, New York and Michigan total 87 Mite full-ice teams and in all likelihood will break 100 teams. The AAU Novice (Mite) programs in Ontario will bolster Mite full-ice opportunities even further throughout the Great Lakes basin.

Ice Jets welcome Tulsa Jr. Oilers to town

"We're excited to get the season going with a weekend of games with the Jr. Oilers," said <u>Karson Kaebel</u>, one of three Ice Jets coaches of mites. Kaebel is joined by Aaron Ciak and Derek Seal.

Karson's brother <u>Klage</u> and <u>Derek Toninato</u> coach the Jr. Oilers mite and squirt teams.

Klage played youth hockey at the AA level and

won an Illinois State Championship and National Runner-Ups. He went on to play Jr. A in the <u>USHL</u> at the young age of 16. Klage played 4 years of Junior hockey and was the leading scorer of his team and a USHL All-Star his final year of juniors. After that he gained a full hockey scholarship to the University of Alaska Anchorage (WCHA) where he played before 6 seasons of pro hockey.

Klage enjoyed playing 4 seasons in Tulsa and was the fan favorite in the 2002-03 season. After retiring, Klage stayed in Tulsa and has worked with Tulsa youth hockey players for the past 10 years.

Derek met Klage in Monroe, when they played together for the WHPL's Monroe Moccasins, and remained teammates the following three years. They won the WHA2 championship together in Jacksonville, Florida.



Derek coached three youth teams in 2004-05 with Karson in Dallas, where his teams won President's Day tournament championships and a Silver Stick regional championship.

Karson and Klage have another brother, Butch, who is an Ice Jets coach.

"Alliances with teams like the Tulsa Jr. Oilers provide an environment that will challenge our players in a positive and beneficial way - and, most importantly, be fun for everyone," Karson Kaebel said.

"Our number one goal is to foster the love of hockey in our teams that my brothers and I have had for so many years.
