Getting Started in AAU Sports

1. AAU Club Membership

Each organization must be a registered AAU Club. You can have more than one team within the same club. Club membership can be completed instantly online at <u>www.aausports.org</u> by clicking on JOIN AAU. Youth club membership fees are \$30 (Club Level 1), \$60 (Level 2), or \$300 (Level 3). Visit <u>www.aausports.org</u> for a list of benefits for each club level. Club membership is valid September 1 to August 31.

2. AAU Individual Membership

To participate in the AAU, all athletes and coaches must be individual members of the AAU. As a member, you can participate in any sport in the AAU. Youth athlete membership is \$12 per athlete. Non-athlete (coach, volunteer, official) membership is \$14. A benefit of AAU membership is sports accident and general liability coverage. For an additional \$2, participants can purchase an extended benefit (AB) membership which extends coverage when participating in non-AAU events. For complete information on insurance, visit www.aausports.org and click on the insurance overview tab.

All AAU Non-Athletes will also be required to obtain PCA Double-Goal Coach® training and certification. The AAU National Office is happy to announce to its members, that this Coaches' Education is FREE for all AAU Non-Athletes. This exciting program is MANDATORY for all AAU Non-Athletes and will be administered by Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA). Please visit <u>www.aausports.org</u> and click JOIN NOW in order to enter and take the MANDATORY AAU/PCA coaches' educational course. Membership may be revoked from non-athletes who do not complete course prior to competition.

To become a member, you can register instantly online at <u>www.aausports.org</u>. By using the internet for registering, you will instantly be able to print your own membership card and start participating immediately! Be sure to register as a club first so you can enter your club code when registering individuals. Individual membership is valid September 1 to August 31.

3. Hosting AAU Tournaments and Leagues

As an AAU Club Level 2 or 3, you can apply for an event sanction to host your own tournaments or leagues. Event Sanction fees are \$50 for a youth event per day maxing out at \$350 (Fees Cap after a maximum of 7 days). Visit our website <u>www.aausports.org</u>, click over on the right in the dark grey box with yellow letters on Event Sanctioning to submit an event sanction application or for more information on sanctioning an event with the AAU.

Sanctioning your event with AAU has many benefits.

4. Local District Directors

5. Insurance and Insurance Certificate Program

As an AAU registered Club you have access to our insurance certificate program. This program offers a verification of insurance for the club, third party practice, event, extended benefit and sponsor certificates. Please visit <u>www.aausports.org</u> and click on the insurance overview tab for a more comprehensive explanation of the entire insurance program as well as information on the AAU insurance certificate program.

How Much Does It Really Cost to Become an AAU Member? What is the Value? Apples to Apples or Apples to Oranges?

Some people will try to tell you that it is very expensive to join AAU. After all, the best always costs the most, right? Wrong. Whether you are a player, a coach, a facility-owner, or an event-operator, there is no better value in sports than AAU.

Before you decide with which organization you are going to affiliate, do your homework. Here are some things you may want to check out.

One Club Membership, Many Teams

In the AAU, your organization can register all your teams in all age groups under one club for as little as \$30. Ask any other organization that you are considering whether theirs is a 'club' membership that includes all teams, or if each team needs a separate membership.

Protect Yourself, Protect Your Club

The many benefits of being an AAU member include the opportunity to play in AAU events, seek an AAU national title, and host AAU events. And, each of your members automatically receives at no extra charge accident and general liability insurance. With every participant in your club having membership in AAU, you are assured you and every one of your players are protected. For athletes, membership is as low as \$12. For \$2 more, an Extended Benefit membership is available. That Extended Benefit membership follows you to non-AAU events, including the insurance benefit. Membership for coaches is \$14, or \$16 for the Extended Benefit.

Ask the other organizations what benefits are included in their fee structure. What events do they offer? If they provide you with insurance coverage, ask how you prove a player is in your club if a claim is filed, and if you add a new participant after you register your club for the first time, how does that participant get added to the policy?

The insurance that you are given with your AAU membership covers damage to premises rented by you, sexual abuse allegations, dental injuries, protection for your volunteers, officials, event operators, and sponsors, and so much more. Be sure to ask the provider of whatever insurance you carry as a team exactly what coverage you have. Be proactive; don't wait until a claim is filed to find out.

This is YOUR Organization

Membership governs the AAU. As an AAU member, you participate in the election of your leadership from the district through the executive level. This allows you to make changes in the state/district/national officials if you are unhappy with the way the organization is being run. With a Club Level 2 or 3 membership, your club can sanction and host AAU events for only \$50/day with a \$350 cap on events that are more than seven days (youth only events). An additional \$20 fee will be added for youth and adult events totaling \$370. Your club can also become a tax-exempt, non-profit organization under the AAU umbrella with a Club Level 3 membership. Ask other organizations whether you get a voice in the leadership of their program. Ask if you can host your own events under their organization and if so, what is the total cost? Ask if you can become a 501(c)3 non-profit under them. In fact, ask if *they* are a non-profit organization.

The Bottom Line

For a club with 50 youth athletes and 6 coaches, the total cost of membership in the AAU is as low as \$684 including your insurance, ability to participate in all events, a voice in your governance, and all the other outstanding benefits AAU brings you. Memberships are valid September 1 to August 31.

Apples or Oranges?

When you consider everything that is included with an AAU membership vs. what other organizations offer, there is simply no comparison. The "best" is actually *less* expensive than "the rest".

EXTENDED COVERAGE (AB) CERTIFICATE: Fees apply. This certificate is for AAU member clubs while participating in events hosted by organizations that are not member clubs of the AAU. These non-AAU events include leagues, tournaments, clinics, etc. This certificate must be obtained by an AAU member club. This certificate insures the named third party in regards to the AAU member club's sole negligence. The entire competing team and coach (non-athlete) must be AAU AB members. If you are a member of the AAU in the AB category and conduct an event that is not sanctioned by the AAU, you forfeit your rights of AB coverage for said event.

Hosting an AAU Event

AAU Club Membership - Register on-line at <u>www.aausports.org</u> and click on JOIN AAU.

Club Membership is necessary to apply to sanction an AAU Event. Other benefits of joining as a club include receiving AAU mailings, event notifications, membership certificate, voting rights in AAU elections and club practice insurance.

Individual Athlete/Coach Membership - To participate in an AAU sanctioned event, each athlete and coach must be members of the AAU. AAU membership is \$12 per youth athlete and \$14 per non-athlete (coach). As a member of the AAU, you can participate in any of the 30+ sports offered by the AAU.

The membership year is from **September 1st through August 31st**. Membership must be renewed each year to be valid.

AAU membership provides each member with sports accident insurance for all properly sanctioned AAU events and supervised practices. For specific details on insurance coverage, please refer to the current insurance brochure located on our web site.

To become a member, go to <u>www.aausports.org</u> and click on JOIN AAU.

AAU Sanction Application Form - A sanction is written approval by the AAU to authorize registered athletes to participate in a specific competition or exhibition. No event is an official AAU event unless the host has obtained an AAU sanction prior to the start of the event. Sanctions are mandatory if you plan to host an AAU event. Instructions for completing and submitting a sanction application and fees are located on our homepage <u>www.aausports.org</u>. Located on the right-hand menu, click "Event Sanctioning". You will need to have a valid club code and individual membership ID of the club contact to submit an event sanction. If you need further assistance, please call 407-934-7200.

All participants in AAU sanctioned events must be individual members of the AAU. As the club sanctioning the event, it is YOUR responsibility to verify that everyone participating in your event is a current AAU member.

To Submit an Event Sanction Application

After obtaining a club level 2 or 3 and an individual non-athlete membership for the contact listed on the club, go to <u>www.aausports.org</u>. On the right you will find a box with yellow lettering; click on Event Sanctioning/Event Sanction Application. You may choose a logo or provide your own. Choose a flyer template or upload your own flyer. All approved event sanctions are posted on our find an event site where more than 10 million viewers have access to your event information.

Order AAU Medals and Awards

As a benefit of sanctioning your tournament through the AAU, you can order AAU medals and ribbons. To order awards, you must submit to the AAU National Headquarters: (1) Awards Application (2) Tournament Flyer (3) Signed Copy of the Approved Sanction (4) Appropriate Fees.

Championship Medals are available for association and regional championships for \$6.32 per set (includes 1 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze medal). Sports for All Medals are available for invitational, league, open, or preliminary events. The cost is \$1.99 per medal (gold, silver or bronze). Ribbons are available for first through eighth place, plus merit. The price for ribbons is twenty-two (22) cents each. Orders must be received at the AAU National Headquarters at least 15 days prior to the event. Orders received less than 15 days prior to the event will be assessed a \$40.00 late fee. A shipping and handling fee of 10% of the total will be charged to each order less than \$1000. Orders \$1000 or more will be charged 5%. In addition, if the order requires next day shipping or 2-day shipping, you must pay the shipping cost via credit card.

Claim Forms

In case of any incidents during your event, make sure you have copies of the AAU Claim Forms at the tournament. These forms should be completed and submitted to the address on the instruction page immediately after an incident. This holds true whether the person involved is a participant or spectator, or whether or not you feel the incident will result in a claim. Please follow all the directions on the form.
