### **DIRECTIONS to EVENT**

Held at: Teaneck Armory, 1766 Teaneck Rd., Teaneck, NJ 07666

**From the George Washington Bridge:** Take Route 4 West to Teaneck Road exit (about 3 miles from G.W. Bridge).

Make right off exit and travel north (towards Bergenfield) for 1.4 miles. The Teaneck Armory sits back on the right side of the road at the intersection of Teaneck Road and Liberty.

**Garden State Parkway (from the south):** Take Garden State Parkway North to Exit 161. Take Route 4 East to Teaneck Road (Bergenfield) and follow from "Make right" above.

**Garden State Parkway (from the north):** Take Garden State Parkway South to Exit 163, to Route 17 South. Take Route 17 for 2 miles to Route 4 East. Take Route 4 East to Teaneck Road (Bergenfield) and follow from "Make right" above under G.W. Bridge directions.

**From Route 80 West:** Travel East on Route 80 to Exit 70. Take 70B and follow signs toward Teaneck; pass the Marriott and turn right at the second light onto Teaneck Road. Travel north on Teaneck Road for approximately 3 to 4 miles (1.4 miles north of Route 4).

**From the New Jersey Turnpike:** NJ Turnpike to Exit 18E and follow signs to the G.W. Bridge. Exit at Teaneck/Leonia Exit and follow signs to Teaneck and follow from "pass the Marriott" above.

#### **BOARD BREAKING COMPETITION RULES**

- Boards must be purchased at <u>tourneyreg.net</u> or at the event. To ensure fair competition, competitors may not bring own boards. All boards are subject to inspection.
- Maximum 10 boards total allowed per competitor per round.
- 90 second maximum setup/break time allowed per competitor
- Competitors <u>must</u> have their own holder(s) to hold their boards. Competitors may
  have multiple breaking station. Any special breaking apparatus must be supplied by
  each competitor. <u>(ALL HOLDERS on the competition floor must be registered</u>
  <u>AAU members. No exceptions)</u>
- No forehead breaking, open flames, blades or human obstacles may be used
- For multiple board techniques, if competitor fails to break all boards, they may reset to the original number of boards, but that attempt will count as a failed attempt for scoring
- Athletes will be judges on technique, focus, balance, power and creativity. For two competitors executing the same technique, a break performed on the 1<sup>st</sup> try is superior to a break completed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> or subsequent try. A two board break is superior to a one board break; a 3 board break is superior to a two board break, etc. A speed break supported on one end is superior to a break supported on both ends (for the same # of boards)
- Single elimination



#### SPEED KICKING COMPETITION RULES

- Holder will use a kicking paddle/target that will be held at athletes belt level.
- Maximum 30 seconds per competitor per round.
- Athlete will choose to use single leg or both legs to kick paddle/target as fast as they
  could to attain the highest number of kicks in their 30 second time.
- An official will be assigned to count the number of kicks of athlete. If foot does not touch paddle or good kick executed, the kick will NOT count toward the cumulative number.
- Athletes are allowed to use single leg and/or change the leg they use during their 30 second time.
- All athletes will have only ONE chance to get the highest score and NO starting over for any reason.
- Athletes with the highest number of kicks in the division will be the winner of the competition.
- Medals will be awarded for first, second, and third place competitors ONLY.

The New Jersey AAU State Championship serves as a qualifier for this year's AAU Taekwondo National Championship held in Fort Lauderdale, FL. All participants at this year's event will qualify for AAU Taekwondo Nationals. We'll be running ten competition rings and offering beautiful custom medals for the top 4 athletes in each division. Our event offers your students a chance to test their skills while gaining valuable experience.

Historically this event brought in over 500 athletes attending in the past and we have taken every meaure to continue running a smooth-running event! Please make sure you provide adequate certified coaches for your athletes since there will be no coach's holds for any matches except for finals. Athletes are required to register and compete at their highest rank achieved. Also, if an athlete is caught wearing (and registering) for a division lower than their current rank, it will be dealt with immediately and severely, so please review our rules of competition prior to the event.
