Alix Klineman was selected as the 2010 Volleyball Magazine National Player of the Year and as the Pac-10 Player of the Year. She earned her fourth All-Pac-10 Conference honors, leading the team and the conference, and ranking second in the nation with 5.55 kills per set and 6.25 points per set. Alix led the team in kills in 29 of the 31 matches this season. This outstanding volleyball player registered a career high 39 kills on 74 attempts and 18 digs at Arizona State; she posted season highs of 20 digs and two assists at UCLA and had her second 30+ kills match of the season against Washington (32). Alix had 14 double-doubles on the year. Klineman put down a career high three aces against Cal and went 14-0-21 against Albany in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament to tie her career high with a .667 attack percentage. As an outside hitter she led all players with 18 kills and three solo blocks in the Second Round against Colorado State; she hit .348 in two NCAA Regional matches with 57 kills, 17 digs, five aces and two blocks. Alix became just the second Stanford player to register 2,000 career kills, finishing with 2,008 (second all-time and fifth-best in the Pac-10). This California native also became just the eighth player in school history to record 1,000 career kills and digs. Named as the Pac-10 Player of the Week three times (8/30, 9/13 & 10/18) and earned AVCA National Player of the Week (9/13). Alix was selected tournament MVP at all three of the team's preseason tournaments (MCM Elegante Lobo Classic, Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic and Stanford Invitationals.) Alix was selected to CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America of the Year and Pac-10 All-Academic Second Team.
