

Maya Moore became UConn's all-time leading scorer on December 5 when she scored the 2,348<sup>th</sup> point of her career. She became just the 45<sup>th</sup> player in NCAA Division I history to score at least 2,500 career points and is poised to become the BIG EAST's all-time scoring leader. Moore was named BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year and honored as a John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top-20 List selection. This basketball star led the Huskies to 12-straight victories to start the season, running their record winning streak to 90-games since the 2008-09 season.

In the classroom, Moore received several accolades for her work in the classroom in 2010, including both the Big East Scholar-Athlete and CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American of the year. She was also the co-winner of the 2010 Honda Broderick Cup, which recognizes the collegiate female athlete who has outstanding athletic achievement, team contributions, scholastics and community involvement.

Moore is a natural leader and the hardest-working player on the team. She's involved with Athletes in Action and has attended numerous leadership conferences through the organization. Moore is also a very gifted musician — she plays guitar, drums and sings — who's very accepting of everyone and can connect with people through music, sports and through her giving personality.

In her community, Maya has been very involved with the Children's Hospital, helping with a teleconference to raise money for sick children as well as visiting children several times. She also volunteered at Geno Auriemma's charity golf tournament and helped the Salvation Army in addition to volunteering at the Hole in the Wall Gang Camp.
