

# 2010 AAU JUNIOR OLYMPIC GAMES

## 3 on 3 Boys' and Girls' Basketball National Championships



- LOCATION:** Boo Williams Sportsplex, 5 Armistead Pointe Parkway, Hampton, VA 23666
- DATES:** Friday, July 30, 2010 Check-In Midtown Community Center  
Saturday, July 31, 2010 Competition Boo Williams Sportsplex  
Sunday, August 1, 2010 Competition Boo Williams Sportsplex
- AAU MEMBERSHIP:** **All athletes and coaches must be current AAU members of the AAU.** AAU membership is \$12.00 per youth athlete and \$14.00 per non-athlete (coach). The cost of membership is in addition to the entry fee. To become a member, join online at [www.ausports.org](http://www.ausports.org).
- ENTRY FEE:** \$120 per team. All fees are non-refundable. The entry fee is in addition to the AAU membership card.
- ENTRY DEADLINE:** All entries must be received no later than: **FRIDAY, JULY 9, 2010**. Entries received after this date may not be accepted.
- QUALIFICATION:** All registered AAU members may participate in this event.
- FORMAT:** A pool play system leading to a championship bracket will be used.
- AGE DIVISIONS:** Boys and Girls  
9U, 10U, 11U, 12U, 13U, 14U, 15U, 16U, 17U and 19U/Senior
- AGE DETERMINATION:** Age as of September 1, 2010.
- PROOF OF AGE:** Participants must have a copy of their birth certificate or driver's license with them at all times during the tournament.
- AWARDS:** AAU Junior Olympic Games medals will be awarded to the top three (3) teams. All participants will receive a special AAU Junior Olympic Games T-shirt commemorating the event.
- CHECK-IN:** A coach must check-in the team on July 30 at the Midtown Community Center located at 570 McLawhorne Drive in Newport News. Please follow the posted signs to the Check-In Area. - PARKING:** The majority of venues for the AAU Junior Olympic Games will offer complimentary parking; however, some locations may have a small fee. This is subject to change. Please note that some hotels may charge for parking. Contact your hotel for more information.

**ADMISSION FEE:** Athletes and coaches with a credential will receive admission to all competition venues and the Celebration of Athletes as part of your entry fee. **RULES OF GAME:** The AAU 3 on 3 Basketball National Championship will be played in accordance with the Rules below. High School Rules are used for all game situations not specifically mentioned in AAU 3 on 3 Rules.

**Art. 1 Court**

The game will be played on a half court of a regular basketball playing court.

**Art. 2 Teams**

Each team shall consist of a maximum of four (4) players (3 players on the court and 1 substitute) and one (1) coach.

**Art. 3 Game Officials**

The game officials shall be one (1) referee and one (1) scorer/timer.

**Art. 4 Beginning of the Game**

4.1 Both teams shall warm-up (3 minutes) simultaneously.

4.2 The game shall begin with a jump ball at the free-throw line (jumpers facing the sidelines). The team that controls the jump ball may attempt a shot immediately. The team that does not gain control of the ball shall be entitled to the ball at the next held ball situation in accordance with the alternating possession rule. The arrow will be directed to the bench of the team which is entitled to the ball at the next alternating possession.

**Art. 5 Winner of a Game**

The first team which scores 25 or more points will be the winner of a game or whichever team is ahead after 22 minutes of running clock. If the game is tied at the end of 22 minutes, play will continue into sudden death.

**Art. 6 Fouls by Player/Fouls by Team**

A player who has committed four (4) fouls must leave the game. A team is in a penalty foul situation (two shots) when it has committed six (6) fouls.

**Art. 7 How the Ball is Played**

7.1 Following each successful field goal or last free throw.

\*A player of a non-scoring team will resume the game by passing the ball from behind the end line to his teammate at any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point line, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.

\*Once the ball is behind the 3 point line a shot may be attempted immediately.

7.2 Following each unsuccessful field goal of last free throw:

\*If the offensive team rebounds the ball, it may continue to attempt to score without returning the ball to behind the three-point line.

\*If the defensive team rebounds the ball, it must return the ball (by passing or dribbling) behind the three-point line.

\*Once the ball is behind the 3 point line a shot may be attempted immediately.

7.3 Following a steal, turnover, etc:

\*If it happens within the two-point area, the ball must be passed/dribbled to a place behind the three-point line. \*Once the ball is behind the 3 point line a shot may be attempted immediately.

7.4 All throw-ins following fouls (without free throws), violations, out-of-bounds, shall be taken from the out-of-bounds level with the top of all three-point-line, closest to the infraction. The referee shall hand the ball to the out-of-bound player. The thrower-in must pass the ball to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point line, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.

**Art. 8 Substitution**

Substitutions shall be permitted when the ball becomes dead.

**Art. 9 Time-Outs**

Each team shall have two (2) 30-second time-outs.
