9th Street parking Garage is \$7 a day (overnight parking allowed)

4th Street Parking Lot is \$7 a day

Meter Parking is \$1 an Hour

Private lot parking is available for fees ranging from \$5-\$20 a day

Where will the courts be set up for the AAU Junior Olympic Games Sand Volleyball Event?

Center courts and morning check-in will take place at 7th Street in front of the Quality Inn Hotel, beach side. Courts will be set up from 6th through 9th street for volleyball.

Courts will be two wide with 10' in between sidelines and 15' between base lines for active play.

Players and spectators can set up outside of these borders.

Even number courts are boardwalk side; Odd number courts are Ocean side.

Water hose is located at the stairs at 7th Street

Where are the restrooms?

There will be port potties located along the sand.

Permanent Public Restrooms are at 17th Street

Can the girls practice on the courts before the tournament starts?

Yes, the courts will be set up for use Thursday and Friday, July 29 and 30th.

You can contact Venesa Walker (volleyball4youth@aol.com, 757-472-8236) to set up scrimmage times with other players that will be participating in the event.

What courts will the 12's be playing on?

We can not guarantee what courts will be assigned to a certain age group, but the 12's courts will be set up between 6th and 7th street. Depending on the number of teams we have registered per age group will decided what courts our other divisions will be located.

Is there a place to rent umbrella's and chairs?

Yes, there is a company that rents umbrellas and chairs. Some of the hotels also offer beach chairs and umbrellas.

Sunrise Beach Services charges \$20 for cabanas, sand chairs are \$7, umbrellas are \$12, lounge chairs are \$12, with pads are \$15. (I don't have a umber for them, they are located on the beach)

Do the junior beach players exchange trinket gifts, like they do for AAU National indoor event?

What will take place at the celebration for athletics? Should the players dress in costume like they do for the indoor national event?

Feel free to dress up and have fun with it; however, it is not the same as indoor. The Celebration of Athletes may include: arts/crafts, food and drink vendors, movie, make your own ice cream sundae, theme games, face painting, inflatable slide, obstacle course, live entertainment and fireworks.

What is the fee for spectators to attend the beach event?

There is no fee for spectators to attend the beach event. Spectators are encouraged to purchase a pass to enjoy the other events in the area. Beach players can get into to other events with their player pass.

Is there a fee to attend the Celebration of Athletes?

No there is not a fee for the Celebration of Athletes for spectators or players. It will take place outdoors along the Oceanside boardwalk where a band will be playing on stage.

Do all ages start at the same time? How long will the event last each day?

All players will met at 8:45am on Saturday, July 31,for a morning meeting to go over the rules, and schedule for the day. Games will begin at 9am. We should finish by 3pm.

What is the format for game play?

The first day will consist of pool play games, best out of three matches. All players will advance to bracket play on Sunday. Sunday's games will be best two out of three matches. Winners will advance, and losing teams will go into the losers bracket. It will be double elimination on Sunday.

Is coaching allowed in beach volleyball?

Coaches are allowed to advise players during timeouts. Coaches are not allowed to call timeouts, or talk to players during match play unless a player has called a timeout. Coaches and parents are encouraged to cheer positive comments. All coaches will need to register and check-in for their badges.

Do we need to bring our own water to the beach event?

We recommended you bring a water bottle that could be filled up with the coolers that will be stationed by the courts. The water coolers are for players only. Spectators will need to bring or purchase their own beverages.

Can we bring our team or club banners to the beach?

Yes, you can set up your club, or team banner on the beach where you will be sitting. Banners will need to be removed each night.

Does our player need to know how to officiate to play in the beach event?

We will have officials available to officiate games. Players are still required to keep score. We use a basic score sheet where they just mark off a number. They also keep track of the serving rotation. There will be plenty of experience players and volunteers around to help players with the score sheet. Parents and coaches are not allowed to keep score for players.

Do all the players get medals or awards?

The top five teams in each age division will receive medals. No additional awards are given out.

Are there other events we qualify for if we place in the AAU Junior Olympic Games?

The U14 team winners will qualify for the "AAU Best of the Beach Event", held in Beverly Hills California August 14-15, 2010.

What is there for our non- playing children to do?

Virginia Beach has a lot to offer. There are two beach playground areas for children to play on one is right next to the volleyball courts, and another one is just a few blocks down that also offers handicap facilities and activities. There is an amusement park on the boardwalk at 13 th street, as well as miniature golf and the Marine Science Museum is just a few miles away. You can take the trolley to the Museum.

VB Wave Shuttle System and Schedule

Route 30 Oceanfront Shuttle – Ride the VB Wave from one end of Atlantic Avenue to the other. Stop along the way at shops, restaurants, museums and more. Transfer to HRT Bus Route 33 at 40th Street to go to First Landing State Park and the Association for Research and Enlightenment. Daily, May 1 – Sept. 30, 8 a.m. until 2 a.m. about every 15 minutes.

Route 31 Aquarium and Campground Shuttle – Ride the VB Wave south to campgrounds and tennis courts, fun parks, and go to the Virginia Aquarium and Marine Science Museum. Catch the Atlantic Avenue shuttle for points north. Aquarium and Ocean Breeze serviced during operating hours only. Daily, May 23 – Labor Day, 8 a.m. until 2 a.m., about every 20 minutes.

Route 32 Shoppers Shuttle – Ride the VB Wave to the trendy, up-scale Hilltop area for shopping and dining. Take it a little further to Virginia Beach's premier shopping experience, Lynnhaven Mall. Daily, May 23 – Labor Day, 9 a.m. until 11 p.m., about every hour.
