AGE

DETERMINATION: Individual events: Coincides with age on the second day of the tournament, August 2, 2014. (Note: The WSSA reserves the right to request proof of age for any stacker.)

Doubles Teams: 6U to 18U compete in division of <u>oldest</u> stacker on team; 19+ to 60+ compete in division of <u>youngest</u> stacker on team.

Relay Teams may be made up of Stackers of multiple ages (e.g., A Relay Team with Stackers of ages 7, 10, 11 and 12 will compete in the 12U division for the Relay events.) Teams 6U to 18U compete in division of **<u>oldest</u>** stacker on team; 19+ to 60+ compete in division of **<u>youngest</u>** stacker on team. Stackers on Teams are limited to competing with only one Team throughout a single event.

Note: Open Division (for Doubles and Relays) = one stacker is 18 or younger and one is 19 and older.

Special Stackers Division - A Special Stacker is defined as a stacker that has a diagnosed physical and/or mental disability that would impede with the normal functioning necessary to perform a variety of sequential physical skills, specifically sport stacking. A Special Stacker must be identified by a school or licensed psychologist or medical professional. AWARDS: AAU Junior Olympic Games medals and ribbons will be awarded to top competitors in each division/event.

CHECK-IN: Participants must check-in at the **lowa Events Center** located at 730 3rd Street, Des Moines, IA 50309 to receive their athlete credential or coach wristband. The appropriate credential or wristband will be needed prior to gaining admittance into the competition venues. Participants should check-in at least the day prior to competing. *If that credential or wristband is lost or stolen there will be a replacement fee.* Parking fees do apply for the lots around the lowa Events Center. PRACTICE: Practice will be available on Thursday, July 31. Time to be announced.

DRESS CODE: Teams are encouraged to wear coordinating outfits, and the WSSA Apparel Code will be enforced per p10 Official Rule Book <u>http://www.thewssa.com/rules/</u>.

Apparel: A Stacker may not compete wearing any added clothing, accessories or equipment that is a distraction to the Judges or other Stackers as deemed by the Tournament Director and/or the WSSA. This would include, but not limited to: headphones, ear buds, ear plugs, sunglasses, blindfolds, gloves, tape, etc. (In the same regard, Stackers may not gain an advantage or distract fellow Stackers by purposefully blocking out sight, sound or touch.) Stackers may not wear apparel or accessories advertising competing brands to Speed Stacks, Inc., the Official Equipment Supplier of the WSSA. Logos and/or statements on apparel and/or other accessories, as deemed offensive or inappropriate by the Tournament Director and/or WSSA are strictly prohibited at WSSA events.

PARKING: Some locations will have parking fees such as the lowa Events Center. Please visit <u>www.aaujrogames.org</u> (click on Event Info, Maps & Parking) for more information. Also, most <u>downtown hotels will charge for</u> parking. Please check with your hotel for specific information as prices vary.
