QUALIFICATIONS: United States athletes must compete and qualify at an AAU District, Regional, and/or Super Regional

Championship in every event in which they wish to be eligible to compete in at the AAU Baton Twirling National Championships (individual, team, and corps events) conducted at the AAU Junior Olympic Games. A competitor can compete in only one status level/age group for each event. All non-United States athletes are invited to participate; however, you must complete a waiver through the AAU Baton Twirling Office in order to compete. For

RULES: Please go to www.aaubaton.org to download the 2015-16 AAU Baton Twirling Rule Book. There are descriptions

of offered events, rule changes, and new rules that are important to know.

AGE DIVISIONS: Solo One Baton, Solo Two Baton, Solo Three Baton, Solo Multiple, Strut (X, Straight-line, etc.), Basic Strut,

Military Strut, Parade Strut, Hoop and Flag: 0-6, 7-9, 10-12, 13-15, 16-18; 19-22

Boys Solo will be separate from girls: 5-9, 10-14, 15+

Solo Dance Twirl and Solo Freestyle ages: 5-9; 10-12; 13-15; 16-18; 19-22

Teams average ages: 0-6 (Tot), 7-9 (Juvenile), 10-13 (Junior), 14-18 (Senior), 19-22 College(University/College)

Corps average ages: 0-9 (Juvenile), 10-13 (Junior), 14-18 (Senior)

Auxiliary Team: Elementary (1st Grade -5th Grade), Junior High (6th Grade - 8th Grade), Senior High (9th

Grade – 12th Grade), Collegiate (Any one Graduated from HS and attending a Bona fide College)

EVENTS: Individual- Solo One Baton, Solo Two Baton, Solo Three Baton, Multiple Baton, Dance Twirl, Freestyle, Collegiate

Half-Time Routine, Hoop, Flag, Basic Strut, Military Strut, Parade Strut, Straight-line Strut, X-Strut, Collegiate Downfield Strut, and All-Around Twirling Champion (includes collegiate champion; see grid below). Individual status of Challenger, Novice, Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced, Elite will be offered. College level will also be

offered in the All-Around Champion event, Collegiate Half-Time and Collegiate Downfield Strut events.

Corps-Twirling Corps and Parade Corps Beginner and Advanced Status

<u>Teams</u>- Twirling Team (March Music), Dance-Twirl Team, Novelty Twirl Team, Street Parade Team, Show-Twirl Team, College Majorette Line, Auxiliary Teams (Pom Line, Dance Line, Drill Team, Guard, Majorette Line). Beginner and Advanced Status.

Team Sizes- Extra-Small Team: Two (2)-Three (3) athletes; Small Teams Four (4) to Nine (9) athletes; Large Teams may have Ten (10) to Nineteen (19) athletes; Extra Large teams may have Twenty (20) or more athletes.

AAU MEMBERSHIP:

All athletes and coaches must be current AAU members. To join, visit www.aausports.org and click on JOIN AAU to become a member of the AAU. BE PREPARED and register your coaches early! You can no longer register for non-athlete (coach) membership onsite at the event. New this year, background screens are conducted for all non-athletes and adult athletes. Membership is no longer instant.

REGISTRATION & ENTRY DEADLINE:

All Entries must be completed online no later than July 8, 2016 at 11:59 PM EST at www.aaujrogames.org . Visa, Master Card, American Express or Discover are accepted. All fees are non-refundable.

You will need to have your AAU membership at the time of registering for the AAU Junior Olympic Games. After registering online for the events in which you have gualified, you will receive an email confirming your entry and acceptance of payment. Once you have registered and paid online, there is no need to send in any paperwork.

Note: Only AAU registered COACHES are authorized to complete Corps, Teams, Duet and Trio Events. Parents, coaches, etc. may enter individual solo events.

The Local Organizing Committee and the AAU spend many hours planning and preparing for this AAU Event. In order to make it a great success, we are asking for your cooperation. It is the responsibility of the coach, parent, instructor, and athlete to ensure that the application is complete in every detail and processed on time.

COACHES, BE PREPARED AND REGISTER EARLY! You may no longer register for non-athlete (coach) membership onsite at the event. New this year, background screening is conducted for all non-athlete and adult members. Membership is no longer instant.

AGE DETERMINATION: The athlete's age will be determined by the athlete's actual age as of December 31, 2016. Athletes must have competed in their AAU District or Regional Championship in the age division in which they will be at the AAU Junior Olympic Games Baton Twirling Championships.

SUBMITTING MUSIC:

A hard copy of music may be sent by a CD or a Flash Drive to AAU National Baton Chair Candice Dowdy: (email files at) candicedowdyaau@gmail.com; (mail files to) 522 Hallowell Circle, Orlando, FL 32828. Music mailed should be sent by: July 17, 2016. Any music submitted will not be used or stored for any other purpose other than your own performance. If your music is NOT turned in one week prior to the start of the Baton portion of the AAU Junior Olympic Games, a 2.0 penalty will be assessed on your score sheet. (See AAU Rulebook-page 15 for specific music information).

COACHES:

All AAU Baton Twirling Coaches wishing to have access to the practice area and competition floor must be wearing an official AAU Baton Twirling Polo Shirt and be a registered coach for the AAU Junior Olympic Games Baton Twirling Championships (See Rule Book for Coach Types and Clarification on each type). To purchase the official polo, visit www.aaubaton.org for an order form, or you may contact Andrea Keane, AAU National Headquarters, at 407-828-3956 or akeane@aausports.org.

To register for the AAU Junior Olympic Games Baton Twirling Championships, visit www.aaujrogames.org and register online. The coaches' entry is \$40 and includes a coaches' gift, t-shirt and event credentials (allowing access to ALL competition venues). The coaches' registration fee is in addition to your non-athlete membership fee. Onsite coach entry may be accepted with a \$10 late fee (\$50 total); however, you must have your non-athlete membership number in order to register as a coach onsite.

COACHES' EDUCATION: The AAU is happy to make available FREE Coaches' Education for all AAU non-athlete members. In its third year, this excellent program is MANDATORY for all AAU non-athletes and will be administered by Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA). Please visit, www.aausports.org and click on PCA COACHES EDUCATION order to enter and take the AAU/PCA coaches educational course. Membership may be revoked from non-athletes who do not complete course prior to competition. (See rulebook for clarification on which type of coach needs to complete education training)

HOUSING:

ONSITE CHECK-IN:

Baton Twirling participants must check-in at the George R. Brown Convention Center located at 1001 Avenida De Las Americas, Houston, TX 77010 to receive their athlete credential or coach wristband. The appropriate credential or wristband will be needed prior to gaining admittance into the competition venues. If that credential or wristband is lost or stolen there will be a replacement fee. For check-in hours, maps and additional directions please visit www.aaujrogames.org (click on Event Info, then Registration). Participants should check in at least the day prior to competing.

PARKING:

TRANSPORTATION:

All participants and spectators are responsible for their own transportation to and from all activities, events, and hotels.
