AGE DETERMINING DATE: The athlete's age on July 1, 2003, shall determine the proper age division.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Entries must be received by Wednesday, July 9, 2002. It is important that all forms are completed and returned together. Overnight delivery is strongly advised in order to meet deadline date. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE DEADLINE DATE OR YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE.

ENTRY CONFIRMATION: TO CONFIRM THAT WE HAVE RECEIVED YOUR PACKET:

- PUT YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS ON THE ENTRY FORM. ONCE YOUR ENTRY HAS BEEN PROCESSED, YOU WILL RECEIVE AN EMAIL CONFIRMATION.
- IF YOU HAVE SENT YOUR PACKET VIA AN OVERNIGHT SERVICE (i.e. FedEx, UPS, Priority Mail) YOU CAN TRACK THE PACKET WITH THE AIRBILL NUMBER. IF YOUR PACKET HAS BEEN RECEIVED AND SIGNED FOR BY THE ENTRY DEADLINE, THEN YOUR ENTRY <u>WILL BE PROCESSED.</u>
- AAU MEMBERSHIP: All athletes and coaches must be members of their AAU Association and <u>be able to present their AAU</u> <u>membership card at time of check-in</u>. To purchase AAU membership cards you can call your local AAU Association at 1-800-AAU-4USA or register on-line at www.aausports.org.
- RULES:
 AAU/Modified International Federation rules. Officials wishing to judge, referee or arbitrate at the 2003

 AAU Junior Olympic Games must have completed the Officials' Certification Course at the AAU

 National Karate Championship and be a current AAU license holder. This applies to all Officials.
- AWARDS: AAU Junior Olympic Games medals will be awarded to the top three (3) places in each advanced division and discipline for the advanced competition.
- UNIFORMS: Solid white GI only with official AAU Karate patch (must be sewn on) is mandatory. NO school or club design on back of the uniform. No lettering or striping may appear on the uniform
- **CAUTIONS:** The following items may not be worn during competition: headbands, jewelry, colored t-shirts, and metal hair clips. Sleeves may not be rolled up. Fingernails should be cut short. Bandages and/or any wraps must be approved by the sports medicine staff on site prior to competition. Regular plastic eyeglasses may not be worn during fighting competition. Lettering on GI is not permitted.

- **MANDATORY EQUIPMENT:** Mandatory for Kumite competitors: Solid white headgear, mouth guards, cups all males, white naugahyde/leather fist guards (no foam plastic type). AAU National Karate Committee approved equipment only. No competitor will be allowed to compete without proper uniform and mandatory equipment.
- **OPTIONAL EQUIPMENT:** Shin and instep guard (white cotton type only), chest protectors (must be worn under Gi), certified prescription safety glasses with strap.

COACHES: Coaches must register with the Local Organizing Committee by submitting the Coaches Entry Form and the \$35 coaches' entry fee. An additional \$10 will be charged for coaches entry forms submitted after the July 9 deadline or for on-site registration.

ONLY AAU CERTIFIED KARATE COACHES ARE ALLOWED ON COMPETITION FLOOR. ALL COACHES MUST BE ASEP CERTIFIED IN ORDER TO ATTEND THE COACHES CLINIC.

Coaches Clinic: Coaches must be registered members of the National AAU Program. Coaches must attend the certification course at the Marriott Renaissance Center located in downtown Detroit in order to be allowed on the competition floor.

ALL COACHES MUST WEAR WHITE GI PANTS AND DARK BLUE AAU COACHES SHIRTS TO BE ALLOWED ON THE COMPETITION FLOOR. (A limited number of shirts will be on sale at the coaches clinics)

Coaches must be properly attired according to AAU Karate Rules. Only proper attire as deemed by the National AAU Executive Committee will be acceptable.

QUALIFICATION: Qualification to the AAU Junior Olympic Games must be determined by actual competition. Qualification may be determined only through: (A) AAU National (Regional) Karate Championships, (B) AAU Junior Olympic Games Qualifier, (C) AAU National Karate Championships.

A. AAU National (Regional) Karate Championship Qualifier

The Regional Championship shall qualify the top four (4) athletes from each appropriate age category from the Advanced and Intermediate Divisions to participate at the AAU Junior Olympic Games.

B. Special AAU Junior Olympic Games Qualifier

The Region may opt, at the discretion of the Regional Director, in lieu of the method prescribed above, to conduct an AAU Junior Olympic Games qualifier separate from the Regional Championships. The Regional AAU Junior Olympic Games Qualifier must conduct the same divisions that are utilized at the AAU Junior Olympic Games. These Regional AAU Junior Olympic Games Qualifiers must be open to all levels within the appropriate age/experience categories. C. AAU National Karate Championship

The AAU National Karate Championships shall qualify the top sixteen (16) from each appropriate age category from the Advanced and Intermediate Divisions to participate at the AAU Junior Olympic Games. The same qualifying criteria apply to athletes registered by the host AAU Association.

ATHLETE CHECK-IN: Pre-Registration: It is extremely important that all entries be received no later than the previously mentioned-deadline date. ENTRY FORM (S) RECEIVED BEYOND THAT DATE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED! Guaranteed overnight delivery will become mandatory if it is the only way to ensure compliance with the deadline date.

On-Site Check-In: Check-In for athletes, coaches, clubs and teams participating in the AAU Junior Olympic Games will be held at Ford Field located in downtown Detroit at 2000 Brush Street.
