TEAM CRITERIA

Developmental Division Team. This group is made up of athletes from various high schools within a particular AAU District that did not make it through the first round of state qualifying tournaments. A copy of a most recent **REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter)** for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. **If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on school stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the High School Jr. varsity level.** If you have several athletes from the same school, you may use one sheet of paper for all of them.

EXTRA ALTERNATES

If you wish to exceed the 17 athlete roster limit you may do so by adding extra alternates. Extra Alternates will be designated on the roster as EXT. They **CANNOT be substituted into your lineup at anytime! These athletes may only compete in exhibition matches!!!

**You may add Extra Alternates to your roster via the Online Registration system.

The 2010 AAU Wrestling Scholastic Duals will be using an online registration system ONLY! This is new to this event but extremely easy to use. Below are some instructions and helpful hints on how to register your team:

1. Fill out Intent to Participate online at www.aauforms.org/intent
2. To register your team(s) please visit www.aauwrestling.net. Scroll down and click on the ONLINE REGISTRATION icon under the Scholastic Duals event information.
3. **Step 1:** Log In/Register (Create an Account) – **The person registering the team must create a user name and password. This is not your AAU membership or club number.** A confirmation email to confirm your information and activate your account. Once your account is activated you can begin to register your team.
4. **Step 2:** Enter Team Information – Add your team information. You can use the same username and password for each team. Community Division 2 size teams that would like to compete in Division 1 must declare your division here.
5. **Step 3:** Enter Athletes to Roster – Not to exceed seventeen (17) athletes. 14 weight classes and 3 alternates make up the roster. **IMPORTANT:** You MUST have each Athletes 2010 AAU Athlete Membership card prior to entering your athletes!
 - a. **Extra Alternates** may be added at this time (\$50 per athlete). These athletes cannot be substituted into your lineup at any time!
 - b. When entering your athletes you will need the following information:
 - i. AAU membership ID
 - ii. Zip Code
 - iii. High School name
 - iv. Weight Class
 - v. Certified Weight
6. **Step 4:** Enter Head Coach, Assistant Coach and Table Worker - Maximum of three [3] non-athletes [head coach, assistant coach, or table worker] per team. **IMPORTANT:** You MUST have Head Coach, Assistant Coach and Table Workers 2010 AAU Non Athlete Membership card prior to entering your coaches and table worker.
7. **Step 5:** Complete Remaining Forms – It is **MANDATORY** to upload a **report card** and **recruitment form** for each athlete. A copy of a most recent **REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter)** for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on school stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the high school varsity level.
8. **Step 6:** Check Out - This is where you pay your tournament entry fee (\$900.00). With a credit card or debit card (VISA, MasterCard, Discover, American Express), you can pay for the tournament. Once this process is completed, you will receive an email confirmation verifying your payment. We recommend printing and saving this email for your own records.

MEMBERSHIP:

All team members, coaches, table workers and clubs must hold current AAU membership cards. Membership cards must be purchased online at www.aausports.org. Memberships **WILL NOT** be sold at on-site registration. Individual athlete cards are \$12.00 each, non-athletes (coaches, table workers, etc.) are \$14.00.

WEIGH-INS & REGISTRATION:

Each team will weigh-in first and then register. Weigh-ins will take place between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm on Thursday June 24th, 2010 for the Community Division 1 & 2 teams, and 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on Friday June 25th, 2010 for the District/All-Star and Developmental Division teams in The Milk House at ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex. **WEIGH-INS WILL BE DONE WITH EACH ATHLETE WEARING A SINGLET.** After each team has weighed-in, the athletes may depart. The Head Coach must stay to register the team. Registration will take place at ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at *Walt Disney World®* Resort. **PLEASE NOTE THE SPORTS COMPLEX IS NOT OPEN TO CHECK WEIGHT BEFORE 10:00 AM on Thursday JUNE 24th, 2010.**

ATHLETES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CHANGE WEIGHT CLASSES AS A RESULT OF A SECOND WEIGH-IN. THE WEIGHT CLASS IN WHICH A WRESTLER CERTIFIES IN; ON JUNE 24th (Community) or June 25th (District/All-Star & Developmental Division) IS THE LOWEST HE OR SHE CAN GO. THIS IS A CHANGE FROM PREVIOUS YEAR.

PARKING: Parking is complimentary at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at *Walt Disney World*® Resort.

CREDENTIAL INFORMATION: Please note, that the credentials issued to athletes and coaches are ATS tickets. These tickets are required at the turnstiles to gain access to ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at *Walt Disney World*® Resort. If an athlete or coach loses their credential, a replacement will be issued at the cost of a General Admission Ticket for the remainder of the event.

RULES: Rules will be according to the National High School Rulebook.

The weights are high school weights: 103, 112, 119, 125, 130, 135, 140, 145, 152, 160, 171, 189, 215, Hwt. (max 285), with a 5-pound weight allowance provided. **NO ATHLETE MAY COMPETE BELOW HIS 2009-2010 HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATION WEIGHT.**

A team shall consist of up to: 2 coaches, 14 wrestlers, 3 alternates and one table worker.
EACH TEAM WILL BE RESPONSIBLE TO PROVIDE ONE TIMER OR ONE SCORER FOR EACH OF THEIR TEAM'S DUAL MEETS.

For competition in the final pools, if two teams have wrestled one another earlier in the tournament, the team that lost the dual may decide not to wrestle the match again without penalty. To exercise this right, the head table must be informed of a team's intention not to wrestle when the final schedule is posted.

THERE WILL BE FOUR (4) DISTINCT COMPETITIVE EVENTS GOING ON AT ONE TIME. YOUR TEAM WILL BE INVOLVED IN ONE OR THE OTHER DEPENDING UPON ITS CLASSIFICATION.

District/All Star Team. This group is made up of athletes from various high schools within a particular AAU District. A copy of a most recent REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter) for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. **If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on school stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the High School varsity level.**

Developmental Division Team. This group is made up of athletes from various high schools within a particular AAU District that did not make it through the first round of state qualifying tournaments. A copy of a most recent REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter) for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. **If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on school stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the High School Jr. varsity level.** If you have several athletes from the same school, you may use one sheet of paper for all of them.

Community Division 1. Larger school division based on 2009-2010 enrollment and 2009 Scholastic Duals Final 8. No more than three (3) wrestlers may come from other schools that make up this team and all must reside in the same AAU District. Any Community Team not meeting these criteria will be moved into the District Division. A copy of a most recent REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter) for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. **If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on the stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the High School varsity level.** If you have several athletes from the same school, you may use one sheet of paper for all of them.

Community Division 2. Division 2 will be determined from the lowest 50% enrollments of the teams entered in the COMMUNITY division. **If a team wishes to compete in division 1 and not be considered for division 2 then they must indicate so on the online registration form.** No more than three (3) wrestlers may come from other schools that make up this team and all must reside in the same AAU District. Any Community Team not meeting these criteria will be moved into the District Division. A copy of a most recent REPORT CARD (3rd or 4th quarter) for each athlete must be provided to determine proof of eligibility. **If a 7th or 8th grader is to be used in competition the**

Principal or Athletic Director must also indicate on the stationery that their state allows those younger grades to compete at the High School varsity level. If you have several athletes from the same school, you may use one sheet of paper for all of them.

Each team member, to be eligible for this event, must have been eligible for his or her 2009-2010 High School season.

POOL PLAY – TEAM / TIE BREAKER [criteria is among those tied]

1. Head to Head competition
2. The team who has been penalized the least for fragrant or unsportsmanlike conduct
3. The team having won the greatest number of victories
4. The team having the greater number of falls
5. The team having the greater number of technical falls
6. The team having the greater number of major decisions
7. The team having the least number of defeats
8. The team having the greater number of offensive points scored among those tied
9. The team having the least number of defensive points scored among those tied
10. The team having the fastest fall

***3 way tie**

*If at any point in the above criteria you are able to determine either a first or third position and the other two teams are still tied at this criteria, then the match between these two tied teams will determine placement, If the teams are not tied at this point, they will be placed accordingly.

Example – placement without tied points

Team 1 – 89 / 3rd place
Team 2 – 93 / 1st place
Team 3 - 90 / 2nd place

Example – Placement [with tied points]

Team 1 – 90 points / 3rd place
Team 2 – 93 points / 2nd place
Team 3 – 93 points / 1st place
[team 3 beat team 2]

***4 or more**

*If at any point in the above criteria, you are able to determine either a first or last position among those tied, then placement will be made for that position. If the other teams are still tied at this criteria, than you will use the same method to determine the next placement. If the last two teams are still tied at this point then the match between these two tied teams will determine their placement. If at any point in the criteria, teams are not tied, they will be placed accordingly.

Example – placement without tied points

Team 1 – 89 / 3rd place
Team 2 – 93 / 1st place
Team 3 - 90 / 2nd place
Team 4 – 88 / 4th place

Example – Placement [with tied points]

Team 1 – 90 points / 3rd place
Team 2 – 93 points / 2nd place
Team 3 – 93 points / 1st place
Team 4 – 87 points / 4th place
[team 3 beat team 2]

IN DUAL MEET COMPETITION, IF TEAMS HAVE IDENTICAL SCORES, THE FOLLOWING TEAM TIE BREAKING SYSTEM WILL BE USED:

- A. The team whose opposing wrestlers or team has been penalized the greater number of team points for fragrant or unsportsmanlike conduct shall be declared the winner.
- B. The team having won the greater number of matches (including forfeits) shall be declared the winner.
- C. The team having accumulated the greater number of technical falls, defaults, forfeits and disqualifications shall be declared the winner.
- D. The team having the greater number of technical falls shall be declared the winner.
- E. The team having the greater number of major decisions shall be declared the winner.
- F. The team having the greater number (total match points) of first-point(s) scored shall be declared the winner.
- G. The team having the greater number of points for near-falls shall be declared the winner.
- H. The team having the greater number of takedowns shall be declared the winner.
- I. The team having the greater number of reversals shall be declared the winner.
- J. The team having the greater number of escapes shall be declared the winner.
- K. The team whose opponent has been penalized the greater number of points for stalling.
- L. The team whose opponent has been warned more often for stalling.

- M. The team whose opponent has the greater number of points for all other infractions (i.e. – false starts)
- N. If none of the above resolves the tie, a flip of a disk will determine the winner.

Upon determining the winning team by use of the tiebreaker system, a single team point shall be added to the prevailing team. The method of recording the score in breaking team ties shall be the score followed by the letter of criteria that broke the tie. (i.e. – Team A-16, Team B-17, criterion E).

MEDALS AND AWARDS:

The top eight teams in each division will each receive a trophy. Individually, there will be awards given for the Outstanding Wrestler, Most Technical and Best Sportsman in all divisions. Wrestlers who had outstanding performances will receive championship medals using the following formula:

1. Any undefeated wrestler, with at least six matches wrestledGOLD
2. Any wrestler with no more than one loss, with at least six matches wrestledSILVER
3. Any wrestler with no more than two losses, with at least six matches wrestled. BRONZE
4. Any wrestler with no more than three losses, with at least six matches wrestled. COPPER

In all dual meets, a team must wrestle at least 80% of their roster OR each athlete that doesn't wrestle will receive a loss to their record.

BOUTS: All bouts will be 2-2-2 minutes in length.

SPECTATOR: Spectator admission is required for all events at *ESPN Wide World of Sports®* Complex.

ADMISSION: Admission Ticket prices are as follows: Adult Daily Admission (\$13.50), Child Daily Admission (\$10.00).
